For years, anyone halfway alternative-minded and concerned about the sluggish advancement of sustainable practices here in Canada will have observed the renewed efforts of the **Green Party** to get a foothold in public representation. Mike Schreiner, whom we met in the late 90s when he was pioneering an organic food box service in Toronto, inspiring us to do the same in our area shortly after, offered some stimulus running for the Greens in Guelph.

Alas, 'twas not to be. It seems like a déjà vu, but once again, the Greens did not get enough votes to secure any seat in parliament. How different in Europe, notably Germany, which Almut had a chance to visit earlier this year. The Greens there can boast around 10% of the seats in their federal parliament.
